Guidelines & Disciplines

The Paris-bourbon County YMCA teen center provides teens with a safe and fun environment where they can develop healthy relationships with other peers and staff. In order to ensure a positive experience at the Teen Center we expect our teens to act respectfully at all times when they're on YMCA property and/or participating in our activities. We take a positive approach towards discipline by developing a community for teens to develop a healthy spirit, mind and body. Teens are to behave in a mature, responsible way, exhibiting the YMCA core values of respect, responsibility, honesty, and care. The Paris-Bourbon County YMCA teen center encourages teens to have fun and engage in a wide variety of activities. However, there are certain rules that are non-negotiable:

- Teens will respect the feelings of all Teen Center participants and members, staff and community members. Disruptive behavior that interferes with program activities will be addressed immediately and in a professional manner.
- Aggressive behavior such as physical violence of any kind, including verbal put-downs, inappropriate language, bullying and disrespectful behavior will not be tolerated.
- Teens will follow directions given by teen center staff regarding safety, rules, programs and activities.
- The Paris-Bourbon County YMCA has authority to terminate and/or dismiss any person in the building whose behavior is non-compliant to YMCA guidelines.
- Participants and staff will respect private property and privacy of others and understand that stealing or vandalism will not be tolerated.
- The use and/or possession of illegal substances (drugs, alcohol, and tobacco) or weapons of any kind is strictly prohibited.
- The YMCA's internet is not for personal use. The YMCA pertains to the right to monitor internet use and browsing. Violation of this policy will result in denial of all access to computer, gaming or internet use in the facility. Access to websites or games containing the following materials is not necessarily permitted by policy: violence, sexually explicit material, drug culture, gambling, intolerance, sexism, racism, militant, gross and/or profane material.

Level 1: Arguing, Swearing, refusing to listen, being inappropriate, etc.

First Incident:

- Staff member(s) will have a Conversation with the teen as to why choices were made. The teen will be provided with a detailed explanation as to why the behavior was not acceptable.
- Redirection from activity or situation may be needed.

Second Incident:

- Staff member(s) will have a Conversation with the teen as to why choices were made. The teen will be provided with a detailed explanation as to why the behavior was not acceptable.
- Parents/guardians will be notified of the situation and informed with details and a future plan of action.
- The teen will be removed from the entire facility for the day.

Level 2: Facility Non-negotiable offenses. These offences include but are not limited to, Violence, (i.e. hurting others, self, or property), Harassment, stealing or threatening staff, participants or community members.

First incident:

- Staff member(s) will have a Conversation with the teen as to why choices were made. The team will be provided with a detailed explanation as to why the behavior was not acceptable
- Parents/guardians will be notified of the situation and informed with details and a future plan of action.
- The teen will face possible suspension or termination from the Paris-Bourbon County Teen Center.

DRESS CODE POLICY

As a family organization we encourage members and guests to maintain an appearance that is not disruptive, distracting, nor offensive in any regard. Therefore we have adopted a modest dress code policy. This policy aligns with the Y's mission and core values so that everyone is comfortable when they come to the Y. Staff may ask a member or guest to change because of inappropriate attire. We hope together we can make the Y the best part of your day! Any article of clothing that is transparent or becomes transparent when wet, may not be worn while participating at the Y, including all areas of our facility. If coming from the indoor or outdoor pool, you must be fully dry, no wet clothes will be allowed in the teen center. You must be clothed in non-swim-wear attire.

Appropriate workout attire is required in the exercise room. No swimsuits or clothing that maybe inappropriate in a family environment allowed. Shirts must be worn at all times. Clothing and jewelry that portray negative messages and are deemed inappropriate by the Y management team must be altered or removed. With exception of special events, swimsuits may only be worn in pool areas. When entering hallways or other areas of the Y you must be covered with a shirt, pants/shorts and footwear. Activity appropriate footwear must be worn in all areas of the Y. If any of these policies are broken, participants, members, and guests may be asked to leave, or appropriately cloth themselves to meet our dress code requirements. We want

everyone to have the opportunity to enjoy our facility and programs. Please help us keep our Y family friendly by adhering to these guidelines.

PUBLIC DISPLAYS OF AFFECTION (PDA) POLICY: All Paris-Bourbon County YMCA Teen Center Program participants and members are expected to refrain from unacceptable public displays of affection whether in the YMCA facility, or at any YMCA sponsored event or field trip. Public Displays of Affection (PDA) will not be tolerated. Unacceptable public displays of affection include, but are not limited to, any prolonged embracing and/or kissing, inappropriate touching, and touching of a sexual nature. This also includes sitting on laps, holding hands, kissing, and hugging. Unacceptable public displays of affection at the Paris-Bourbon County YMCA, including all of its areas and facilities, are in poor taste, disruptive to the educational environment, and may violate sexual harassment laws. Students, visitors, participants, and members who violate this policy may be subject to disciplinary action, counseling and/or parental intervention.

NONNEGOTIABLE AND OTHER OFFENSES The offenses listed below are nonnegotiable and other offenses that will warrant immediate departure from our facility, suspension from our memberships and programs, and possible termination from the program as well: Using or possessing alcohol or illegal substances on YMCA property, Smoking & or Vaping in the YMCA facility. Carrying or concealing a weapon or any device or object that may be used as a weapon. I have read the Paris-Bourbon County YMCA Teen Center Behavior guidelines disciplinary policy and dress code policy agreement. By signing this document, I fully understand the actions that will take place if I break this policy.

Release of Liability for Activities, Projects, and Field Trips

Every kid deserves the opportunity to discover their passions and to develop into young adults with strong core values. Our Teen Center staff are passionate about bringing these opportunities to fruition under their positive guidance. Every interaction we make with our youth participants is an opportunity for learning, growth and development.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

The Paris-Bourbon County YMCA is a non-profit community based health and human services organization that is committed to strengthening the foundations of the community. The Y recognizes the need to serve all members of the community regardless of their ability to pay the full cost of a membership or program fee. Financial assistance is available for those who demonstrate financial need based on household income and number of dependents. Applications may be picked up at the Y. Please return the completed application and requested documentation to the front desk. Application processing takes 10 days after the Y receives the completed application. Those who qualify will be asked to pay only a portion of the established rate. Generous Y members and other community leaders contribute the remaining amount through the Y Annual Campaign.

The outdoor pool will open beginning in May. It will remain open daily through August and then will remain open from 4 p.m. - 6 p.m. weekdays and regular hours on weekends through Labor Day.

Outdoor Pool Admission:

- Members: FREE
- Non-members: \$5 adults, \$4 ages 18 and under, \$16 per family (up to 5) and \$4 for any additional family members.
- Ages 2 and younger are free.

MEMBERSHIP CARD

Your membership card is essential to checking in at the Y. Proper use of the membership card is expected. Membership cards are for your use only. Any member that allows another to use his or her membership will have their membership revoked. Lost or stolen cards can be replaced for a \$4 fee and photo ID must be verified.



MEMBERSHIP/PROGRAM INFORMATION

DEAR PARENT/GUARDIAN,

Welcome to the Paris-Bourbon County YMCA's Teen Center Program (TCP). We are looking forward to your participation and believe you and your teen will find the program to be engaging, fun and rewarding. Please review the following information to assist you through the registration process.

TEEN CENTER PARTICIPATION/MEMBERSHIP

Membership will be required to participate in and enjoy the Paris-Bourbon County YMCA Teen center. This is to enhance the security, safety, and check-in system for our Teen Center and its participants. Membership information will be available at our front desk in our main entrance lobby.

MEMBERSHIP

The cost of membership to access and use our Teen Center is below:

Teen (12 - 18 yr) Membership - \$20.00/Month
One time joining fee of \$25.00

GUEST POLICY

Guests, 12-17, who are not Y members may use our Y by paying \$5.00 per visit. 18 years or older, who aren't Y members may use our Y by paying \$10.00 per visit. A visiting family will be charged \$25 per visit (2 adults & 3 children). Any additional children to a family are \$5.00 each. Restrictions may apply.

CHECK IN & SECURE ACCESS

The check-In process for your teen is safe and secure. At the entrance, there will always be someone to greet you. You will need to check-In the same way you do at our main lobby entrance by scanning your personal Y membership card. This allows us to keep track of who has checked in and to monitor the safety of our members. You will follow the same process to check out of the teen center as well.

To ensure the safety of our Teen Center members and participants we will have security cameras installed in our teen center. Our teen center will also be staffed at all times.

RENTALS

The teen center space will be available for renting out for birthday parties.

Saturday 2-5pm, 5:30 - 8:30pm - \$350 or Book Both Time Slots for \$700

To rent out our Teen Center space you must read and sign our Paris- Bourbon County user agreement.

- Parents/guardians will be notified of the situation and informed with details and a future plan of action.
- The teen will face removal from the entire YMCA facility for the day.

Level 2: Violence, (i.e. hurting others, self, or property), Harassment, Stealing or Threatening Staff, Participants or Community Members are non negotiable offenses.

- **FIRST INCIDENT:**
Staff member(s) will have a Conversation with the teen as to why choices were made. The team will be provided with a detailed explanation as to why the behavior was not acceptable.
- Parents/guardians will be notified of the situation and informed with details and a future plan of action.
- The teen will face suspension/termination from the Paris-Bourbon County YMCA Facility.

NONNEGOTIABLE AND OTHER OFFENSES CONTINUED

- Inappropriate use of cell phones in the YMCA's shower and locker room areas.
- Inappropriate use of bathroom, showers, and locker room areas by disrespecting the privacy of others; not properly disposing of excreted matter.
- Harassment or intimidation by words, gestures, body language, or any type of menacing behavior.
- Physical contact with another person in an angry, aggressive or threatening way.
- Verbally abusive behavior, including angry or vulgar language, swearing, name-calling, or shouting.
- Sexually explicit conversation or behavior: any sexual contact with another person.
- Theft or behavior that results in the destruction or loss of property.
- Vandalism of YMCA equipment, facilities, and/or any supplies.
